The impact of my work crosses diverse contexts, including: developing tools for air accident investigation, flight training, training tools for the agricultural sector, safety audit training in the small business sector, identifying competencies for the PR and communication management industry and improving learning. I have a particular interest in the role that technology plays in learning and developing work expertise. Technology that I have developed includes a computer-based, examination-on-demand system (CALES) which was used by the New Zealand Civil Aviation Authority for pilot theory examinations; a learning style website that is used by tertiary students to improve their learning and by their teachers for developing more relevant teaching methods; a learning style evaluation website for workplace training and a webbased simulation game for teaching workplace equity. My current research focuses on occupational competency identification, blended learning for tertiary students and mobile learning.

My teaching areas cover: postgraduate research methods, human resource development (HRD), human factors. learning and teaching and equity in the workplace.
